

3 Steps for Determining a Learning Disability and Requesting Accommodations

Step 1: Assessment

Schedule an assessment at one of the following learning centers:

Kreeger Learning Center on College Avenue 732-932-1443

Cook/Douglass Learning Center 732-932-1660

Busch/Livingston Learning Center 732-445-0986

The assessment is free, typically takes less than an hour, and consists of answering a series of questions. The assessment is not a test. An accurate diagnosis can only be made through a clinical evaluation. You'll first be given a diagnostic evaluation application to complete.

Step 2: Diagnosis (Two options)

Contact the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology (GSAPP) at 732-445-6111 x23 to schedule an appointment for testing. Leave a message for Olga Diamantis, and she will return your call within 48 hours. The cost is \$450. Be sure to bring a copy of your assessment documents to your appointment.

Step 3: Accommodations

Contact the office of Disability Support Services at 732-932-2848, to provide them with a copy of your evaluation results and to schedule an appointment regarding accommodations. You are also encouraged to use the services of the Rutgers Learning Centers, such as meeting with a tutor or making an appointment for academic coaching.
